INTRODUCTION

This brief is to provide background for a change in use application to a property located at 27 Airport Heights Drive, St. John's. The property has been a fixture in the east end of St. John's since the early 1950's and remembered as Bursey's Store.

The current owners, purchased the property on November 1, 2011, and lived and operated the convenience store for almost 7 years. The operation closed August 30, 2018.

BACKGROUND HISTORY

The building was built in the early 1950's by as a convenience store and personal residence and as noted, operated as Bursey's Store for many years. The Bursey's added an extension in the 1970's to expand the commercial operation. In the mid 1990's the owner/operator at the time expanded the residential area over the 1970's extension. When the City expanded in the 1980's, it included the Airport Heights area. Zoning was implemented a short time after. At the time, there were five (5) properties in the area with commercial utilization. This property was the only property with a commercial component that was not assigned a commercial zone.

In 2009, a Marie's Mini Mart opened in close proximity which had an impact on the operation as a convenience store, as did the realignment of Airport Heights Drive some time later. The operation survived due to a loyal customer base. In the summer of 2018, an Orange Store opened on World Parkway. The store known as Mr. B's Mini Mart and Deli ceased to operate several months later as it was not able to compete with large chain pricing.

SITE

The site comprised of a 996 SM (10,725 SF) corner site with 34.39 M (113F) frontage on Airport Heights Drive and 28.289 M (93 F) frontage on Hall's Road.

BUILDING

The original portion of the building was built as a convenience store and residence in the 1950's. The store was extended in the 1970's and the residential portion was extended over the 1970's extension in the mid 1990's. The building contains a total area of approximately 6000 SF and is a 2 ½ storey wood frame and masonry structure. The main floor in it's entirety is given over to the former convenience store operation and contains a total of 274 SM (2950 SF). The upper storey and a half is one residential unit.

PARKING

There is paved parking off Airport Heights Drive along its entire frontage. Additionally, there are two (2) interior parking spaces (for staff) on the south side of the building and two (2) on the north side of the building. In addition, there is a separate paved driveway off Hall's Road that can accommodate four (4) compact cars or two (2) large vehicles.

ZONING

The property is zoned Residential Low Density (R-1) and is believed to have been since the expansion of the City in the 1980's. Currently, there are five (5) properties with commercial usage in the Airport Heights area, west of Portugal Cove Road. All but the property at 27 Airport Heights Drive are within a Commercial Neighbourhood or Commercial Industrial Zones. One other property on Airport Heights Drive was a former Day Care that was in the Residential Low Density Zone (R-1) but changed in 2018 to a Commercial Neighbourhood (CN) Zone.

PURPOSED OPERATION

The proposed operation of a Restaurant will be well suited for the area. The property is located at the start of Airport Heights Drive and will not draw additional traffic into the residential areas of Airport Heights unlike the former daycare that recently had its zoning changed to commercial neighbourhood.

The former operation, on average had 350 customers per day while the Restaurant is not expected to draw more than 100 customers per day and is thereby less intense.

The purposed operator is to occupy both the commercial and residential units and as they will live on site, this will put less strain on parking and traffic. The property is currently vacant and the purposed operator will be doing renovations and upgrades to accommodate the change in use, thereby enhancing the property and the neighbourhood. Additionally, the purposed operator is from Central Newfoundland and will be an addition to the city's population and workforce, not just moving locations within the city.

MORE INTENSE USE/TRAFFIC

The property at 27 Airport Heights Drive is bound on the north by Virginia River, the east by Airport Heights Drive, the south by Hall's Road and on the west by a residential property frontage on Hall's Road. The property has operated as a convenience store from 1952 up to 2018.

Within Airport Heights, the property at 27 Airport Heights Drive is the only property with a commercial component that is not within a Commercial Zone. Just to the north is a property containing Marie's Mini Mart and Doctor's offices also Zoned Commercial Neighbourhood. Opposite the property is city owned land that is Zoned Commercial Industrial. On Rhordora Street, just to the south is more city owned land Zoned Commercial Industrial and a property containing Provincial Refrigeration that is Zoned Commercial Industrial. So, while 27 Airport Heights Drive is Zoned Residential Low Density, there is extensive Commercial properties in the immediate area.

As a convenience store we would serve an average of 350 customers per day with the highest concentration at lunch and supper hours. The busiest days were Friday and Saturdays. As a restaurant, the purposed operator is expecting his busiest times to be lunch and supper with Fridays and Saturdays being his busiest days and is expecting just in excess of 100 customers per day. Also there were many deliveries on a daily and weekly basis from a number of suppliers, such as, beer, milk, etc., but with a restaurant you won't have deliveries of that magnitude which impeded traffic.

As a convenience store, the customers would stay generally no more than 5 minutes while as a restaurant they would be there for approximately one hour. Therefore, there would be less vehicle traffic entering and exiting the property.

With regards to traffic flow, vehicles entering and exiting the property would have minimal effect on the traffic flow. Airport Heights Drive from the Portugal Cove Road intersection to beyond 27 Airport Heights Drive to McNiven Place is three lanes with a turning lane for traffic

travelling north wishing to make a left hand turn. Therefore, vehicles wishing to turn left into the parking lot would not restrict the traffic travelling north on Airport Heights Drive.

To reiterate:

- The property has been commercial since 1952;
- The former use of a convenience store had on average 350 customers per day, significantly more than that expected as a restaurant;
- A significant decrease in supplier deliveries;
- The property is in an area of Airport Heights that has excessive commercial development and a restaurant would not be out of character for that area;
- There is limited residential property bounding on the property;
- There is a turning lane in front of the property thereby limiting traffic congestion.

My family and I live at Hall's Road and would like to express our concerns with the proposal to change the occupancy of 27 Airport Heights Drive to an eating establishment.

As per city regulations designated parking has been proposed for 11 parking spaces. I feel that this will constitute an issue when the restaurant becomes more established in the neighborhood, and the number of spaces will no longer be adequate. Hence, parking will be overflowing to the adjacent street, Hall's Road. Since I reside at the lower end of Hall's Road, patrons of the restaurant will be compelled to park in front of my property. This happened quite often when the previous owners had the convenience store in the same location.

As a result, this causes a blind spot to traffic when exiting our driveway forcing you to drive wide out into the street in the opposing lane. This situation often resulted in many near misses with other vehicles driving up Hall's Road.

Please present my serious concerns to council for final decision and I look forward to news that considers these concerns.

My only concern would be available parking for those living on Leslie St and Brownrigg. While many homes have their own driveways, many do not and parking near your home is always a problem. this is exacerbated during winter months.

I believe that there will be a butcher, a prep area, a restaurant and an administrative space at 722 Water St. I'm not sure if the notice I received about a dwelling at this address refers to these or another type of occupation for this address. The parking space at this address will only be sufficient for the employees of this establishment! It is a small parking lot. I have lived at 19 Leslie St since 1995 and am aware that even as a pharmacy and convenience/deli there was not enough parking to accommodate that business without spillage into the neighbourhood. In recent years there seems to be an increase in rentals in this neighbourhood, hopefully all of them are registered, which has limited parking for permanent residences. I take responsibility during the winter months to shovel 1 1/2 to 2 car lengths in front of my house then a visitor or rental occupant will park there! I have written to the city before asking for permit parking with no response.





Unadjusted year-over-year sales in January in the following industry groups increased: limited-service restaurants (+6.2%) and at full-service restaurants (+4.5%). <u>Statistics Canada</u>.

The Port of St. John's is expected to see a 58% increase in cruise ship visits this year. More than 40,000 passengers and about 16,700 crew are set to visit the capital city between April and October onboard 38 ships. There were 24 actual cruise visits in 2018 as three ships had to cancel. Cruise vessels are coming earlier in the spring and visiting later in autumn, increasing the length of the cruise season. There are two planned overnight stops this season as well. The City continues to work with Cruise NL to build relationships with cruise lines and to market St. John's as a port of call.
